

Presentation of Materials Submitted For the Seventh International Conference of Textile Research Division

The full paper should be sent to the conference secretariat not later than July 1st, 2010.

The full paper is normally around 20 pages; A4 in size. Authors should adopt the approved format.

Manuscripts:

- Manuscripts should be written concisely (~20 pages) or by e-mail, and on one side only in **two columns according to the Camera- Ready Format**. A 2.5 cm margin should be left on both sides of all pages.

-The first page should give the title, author(s) names, affiliation(s) and key words (6-8 words).

-The first page should carry also an abstract (230 words).

-Subsequent sections should be: Introduction, Experimental (Materials and methods), Results & Discussion, and References.

-Spelling should be existent through the paper and according to the Oxford Dictionary.

-Data have to be presented either by tables or by graphs. Photographs should be glossy and of as rich contrast as possible.

-Tables should have roman figures. Each one should contain descriptive title, making clear the results presentation in it.

-Figures receive Arabic numbers. Figure dimensions should be usually concordant with the column size.

A short clear legend for the figures should be given. Reference to figures in the text should be given to indicate the most suitable place for including the figures.

-Structural chemical formulae should be presented in size suitable for reproduction.

-Mathematical formulae are most preferable to be presented on the same line and not in the form of numerator and de-numerator.

-Footnotes in the text should be indicated by asterisk and the corresponding symbols separated by a line from the text itself, should appear with the details at the bottom on the same page.

-Abbreviations rather than words are able to be used as: cm, nm, m, km, cc, ml, g. mg, min, hr, m.p., b.p., cal, kcal, exp,....etc.

-References in the text should be made using consecutive Arabic numbers in brackets over the line.

Journal and book reference should be identified in the text by enclosing in brackets and should be numbered in order. Literature references should be listed at the end of the manuscript, using the following style:

A. Polson, "Title", Biochem. Biophys. Acta, **19**, 53, (1959).

In the text, the reference appears by the number, e.g; ⁽¹⁾.

References to books include the name of author, title, publisher, city, date of publication and page, as follow:

R.N. Sherve, "the chemical process industries", McGraw-Hill Book Company Inc., New York, p. 81 (1945).

N.B. Word-processing processing package (words 2003 or word XP), using font 14 of **Times New Roman** for the text, the title of paper is bold, the author's name and affiliation are 13 and sub-subtitles are written using *14 bold/italic*.
